



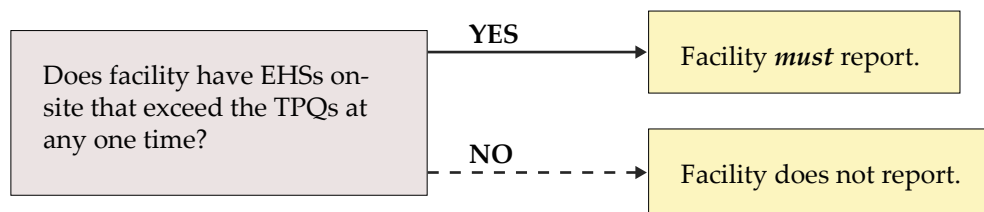
## Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA)–(SARA Title III)

### Applicability of SARA Title III: Main Components

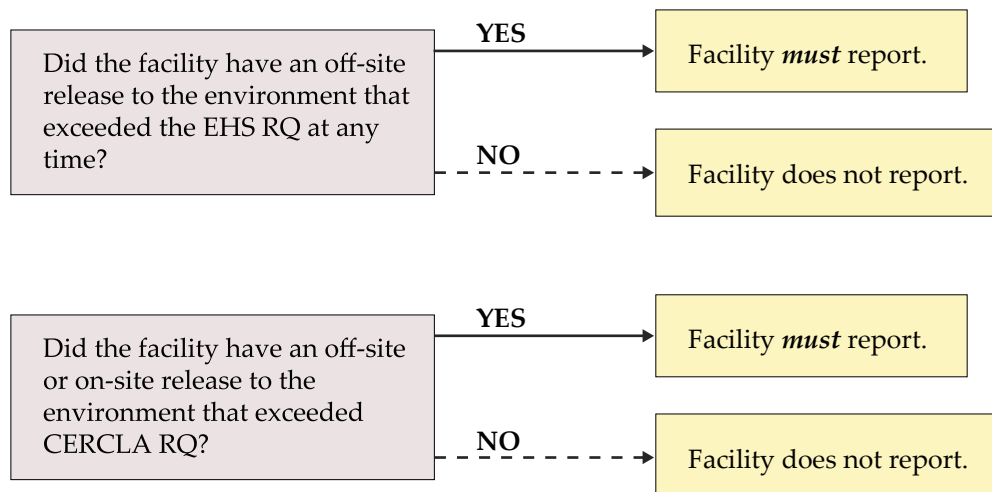
#### Section 302 — Emergency Planning Notification

Refers to the presence, at any one time, of an extremely hazardous substance (EHS) stored at or above the threshold planning quantity (TPQ) found in the [EPA List of Lists](#) document.



#### Section 304 — Emergency Release Notification

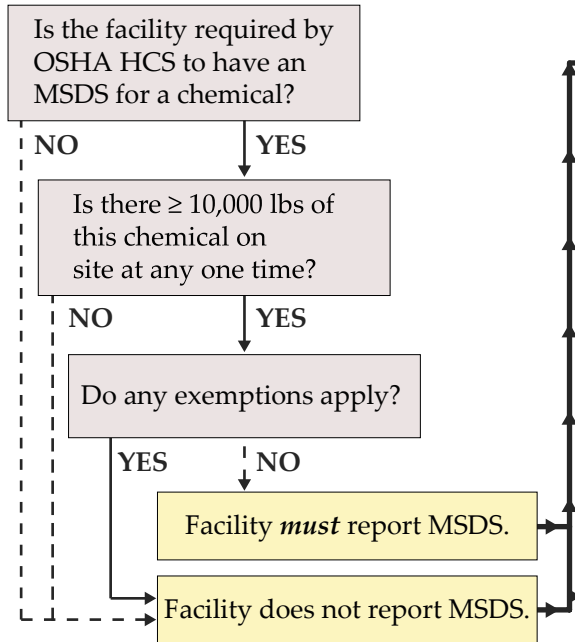
Refers to the emergency release of a toxic chemical with a reportable quantity (RQ) found in the [EPA List of Lists](#).



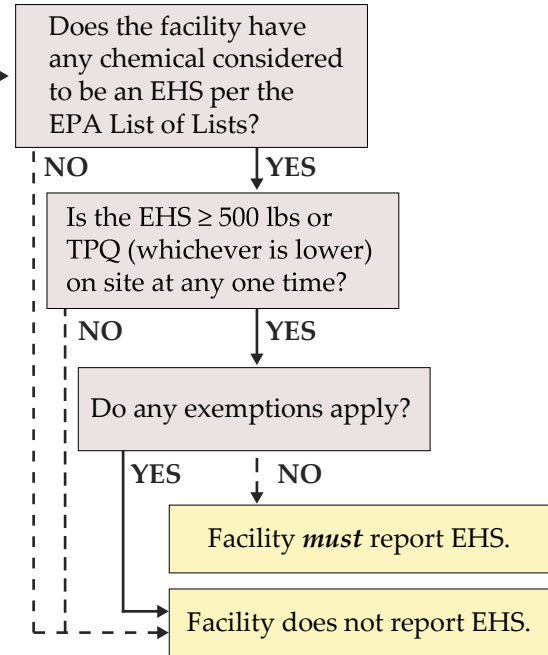
## Sections 311 & 312 — Hazardous Chemical Inventory Reporting

Refers to the presence, at any one time, of a chemical that is required to have a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Hazard Communication Standard (HCS).

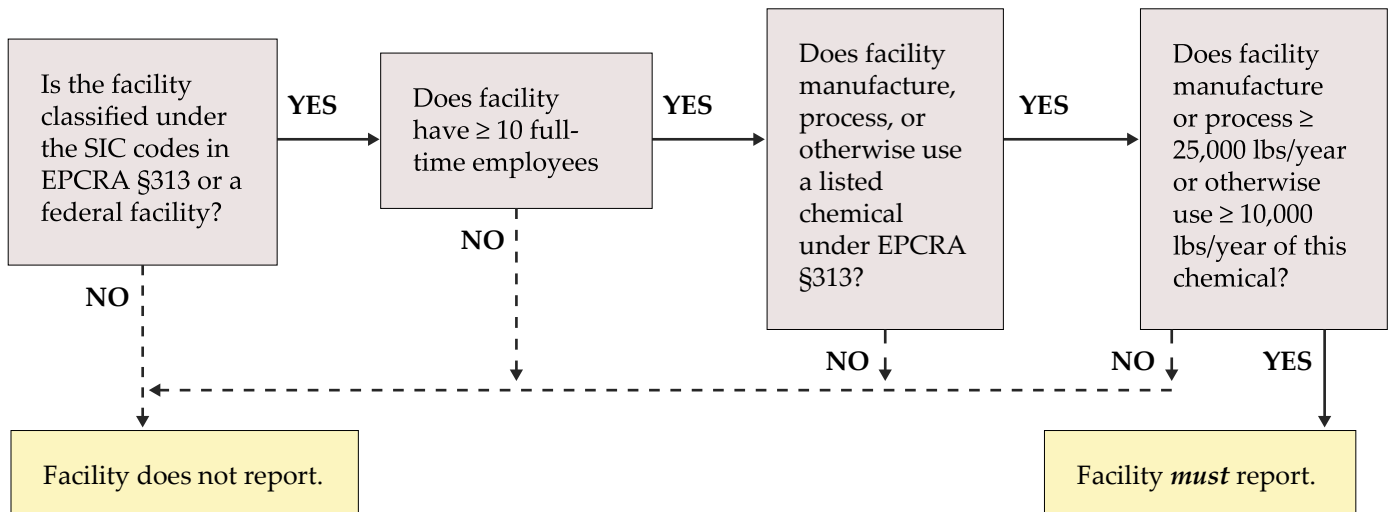

## Section 313 — Toxic Release Inventory

Addresses the release (routine or accidental) of certain toxic chemicals found in the [EPA List of Lists](#) that are manufactured, processed, or otherwise used in the calendar year.
