




GECAP Companies

- 245 firms served in Georgia
- 77% manufacturing firms
- 230 employees on average



Assistance Requests



 Hazardous waste is the #1 concern, followed closely by industrial storm water

Based on 474 requests, 2006-2010

Purpose of Survey

- To understand the evolving needs of the business community in Georgia with respect to environmental regulations by gauging the challenges and opportunities in the regulated community
- To back up anecdotal evidence with empirical data
- Online survey sent to GECAP mailing list
- Response rate of ~18%






How confident are Georgia businesses in their knowledge of relevant environmental regulations?



- Survey oversampled savvy and conscientious firms
- GECAP companies are well served by the free assistance
- 18% still not confident




What are the most significant environmental concerns for Georgia businesses?





What are the main barriers to compliance for Georgia businesses?



78% feel there are at least some barriers to compliance, confusing regulations were the most cited reason (47%)



Additional Findings

- 69% feel they have adequate resources to be in compliance
 - 24% are "not sure"
- 36% feel pressured to meet certain nonregulatory environmental standards
 - (57% of these firms specifically cited ISO 14001)





Implications

- Environmental regulation has a positive effect on competitiveness of domestic firms by stimulating innovation
- Public's increasing demand for environmental protection drives increased environmental regulation
- GA firms are feeling pressure to adopt ISO 14001
- Should GA move toward adopting formal standards?
- Survey results helped GECAP recalibrate our focus in order to better provide technical assistance
- Next steps: educational materials, training, etc.
